
Important Dates

- Beginning of construction of Castillo San Felipe del Morro -1539
- English Attack led by Sir Francis Drake- 1595
 English Attack led by Sir George Clifford, Earl of Cumberland
 - Construction of Fort San Juan de la Cruz (C.1601-1610)
 - Beginning of construction of Castillo San Cristobal-1634
- Visit of Field Marshall Alexander O'Reilly-1765
 Encirclement of Old San Juan with a masonry wall is completed-1785

British Attack of 1797 led by Sir Ralph Abercrombie Bombardment of the city of San Juan by Admiral William Sampson-1898 Creation of the San Juan Military Reservation-1901 Establishment of San Juan National Historic Site-1949 Transference to NPS -1961 World Heritage Site -1983 (with La Fortaleza, the Governor's Mansion) National Historic Landmark-2013 (as part of the Old San Juan Historic District
